## HOW TO USE THE GUIDE

### **Section 1: Interview Questions**

Questions are divided by “Need to Know” and “Nice to Know” to help you prioritize the interview. Print a copy of the questions for each person from your team who will be attending the interviews.

### **Section 2: Notes & Observations**

Print a copy for every new agency interview. Take down notes, observations or other thoughts that stand out to you during the meeting.

### **Section 3: Rate Your Impressions**

Tie a numerical score to each answer to you help quantify your evaluation. After the interview, you can compare your scores with other team members.



## SECTION 1: Interview Questions

Print as many copies as you need before heading into your interview.

### I Need to Know...

- What's your company's positioning? Do you have a specialty?
- How do I fit into your client base, size-wise (larger, smaller, average)? *You'll want to know that they can handle your needs. Plus, this can hint at what level of service you get—for example, if you're smaller, you likely won't get as much attention.*
- What is your website philosophy? What do you pride yourself on?
- Can you tell/show me examples of similar companies or projects you've done?
- Tell me about your culture. What are your values? What are your people like?
- What is an "ideal" client for you?
- What tech stack do you prefer to work in?

### I'd Like to Know...

- What does working together look like? *You'll want to know about preferred communication style and frequency, project management systems, etc.*
- What's your approach/steps? What do timelines typically look like?
- What's your creative process like?
- Tell me about the team I'd be working with? What are their backgrounds? What are their personalities like?
- Do you offer any guarantees or risk-sharing? What if I'm not happy with the results or performance?
- What kind of post-launch support or services do you offer? What can I expect 30-60 days after launch?
- BONUS QUESTION: Do you have any initial observations about my current site?
